V. Student Conduct Requirements

While under school jurisdict on, students are required to conduct themselves at all times in a manner that is in the best interest of the school and community. It is expected that students will:

Procedures for Administrat ve Placement at The Center for Innovat ve Learning (CL):

In certain circumstances, a student may be placed in the alternative set inglaf er an accumulation of level II infractions with a conference and the parent/guardian. This agreement must be in place **prior** to the student commiting an expellable of ense.

Procedures, Hearings, and Appeals of Expulsions

A recommendation for expulsion will be confirmed by the school level Assistant Superintendent. The Assistant Superintendent may require an additional conference with the parent or guardian before confirming a recommendation for expulsion.

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NOTE: The administrat on will make the final judgment on the appropriateness of dothing and/or appearance and reserves the right to prohibit students from wearing any art desof dothing or other items which lead to or result in the disrupt on of or interference with the school environment and student safety. In the event the administration determines a student's dress is inappropriate for school in accordance with this policy, the administration will either require the student to change or will inform the student not to wear the garment to school again. Repeated violations of the Dress Code will be addressed as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct.

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OFFENSES AND DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

HIGH SCHOOL BEHAVIOR CONSEQUENCES BY LEVEL

Though not specifically mentioned in the list of behaviors, students may be suspended or recommended for expulsion for first-time of enses or any act which is detrimental to the good order, best interest, and physical safety of the school. The student may be disciplined according to the nature and degree of the of ense or act at the discretion of the administration.

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Behavioral misconduct is defined as those activities engaged in by a student which tend to impede orderly classroom procedures or instructional activities, orderly operation of the school, or the frequency or seriousness of which disturb the classroom or school. The provisions of this regulation apply not only to within-school activities, but also to student conduction the school bus, and at other school-sponsored activities.

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Disrupt ve conduct is defined as those act vities engaged in by a student which are directed against persons or property, and the consequences of which tend to endanger the health or safety of oneself or others in the school. Some instances of disrupt ve conduct may overlap certain criminal of enses, just fying both administrative sanctions and court proceedings. Behavioral misconduct (Level I) may be reclassified as disrupt ve conduct (Level II) if it occurs three or more times. The provisions of this regulation apply not only to in-school activities, but also to student conduct on a school bus and at other school-sponsored activities.

Level II - Disrupt ve Conduct

Disrupt ve conduct is defined as those activities directed against persons or property, which tend to endanger the health or safety of oneself or others on a school vehicle. Disrupt ve records of violations are cumulative. Acts of disrupt ve conduct with enforcement procedures or sanctions to be applied shall include but are not limited to the following violations.

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Level III - Oriminal Conduct

Criminal Conduct is defined as those activities that result in violence to oneself, another person, or destruct on of property. These actions pose a direct and serious threat to the safety of oneself or others on a school vehicle. Criminal conduct usually requires administrative actions, which could result in the immediate removal of the student from school, the intervention of law enforcement authorities, and/or action by the Board of Trustees. Level III violations may lead to a student's immediate removal from the bus at the school or bus transportation of ice. Acts of criminal conduct may include, but are not limited to the following violations.

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The South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) maintains the following position regarding transporting band instruments and other carry-on items on school buses:

The primary purpose of the school bus is to provide safe transportat on for students to and from school and school-related act vit es. The safety of students and other passengers is paramount when transporting band instruments and other large items. Any item carried on a school bus must be of such

size that it can be transported in the student's lap. Any home project, musical instrument, or other items which would create a hazard or block the aisle or vision of the driver is prohibited. This is necessary to ensure that all items are kept under the control of the student at all t mes in case of an accident or an emergency and that those items do not prevent or hinder the evacuat on of the bus in the event of an emergency.

The United States Department of Transportation, National Highway Trafic Safety Administration, Standard 17, Pupil Transportation Safety, reads in part:

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
