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Course objectives are created based on the South Carolina College-and-Career Ready Standards designated as English 3 Priority Standards by Aiken County Public Schools. English 3 is a survey course focusing on British Literature. Students are expected to utilize the skills they have learned in English 1, and 2 (identify various genres of literature, analyze literature, view literature in historical context, write in different formats and for different purposes, conduct research, participate in class discussions and small groups, conduct interviews, and give presentations) and apply those skills when analyzing pieces of British literature. This course requires students to read extensively and write daily.
