

In Reading, the weekly skills assessments and benchmark tests will be averaged together. In Math, the weekly skills assessments and unit tests will be averaged together. In ELA, composition will make up 40% of your child's grade. Grammar will make up 40% and spelling will make up 20% of your child's grade. All graded work will be sent home on Wednesday in a blue Graded Papers Folder. Parents should review, sign and return all of the tests in the blue folder on Thursday.
