**Spelling** Students can expect a spelling list and test each week. Each Monday, a spelling list will be stapled in the students . Students can expect spelling homework Monday Wednesday and the spelling test will be on Thursdays. We will start out writing our spelling tests and move towards students taking their test on Schoology. More information will come as we move into utilizing Schoology.

<u>Standards</u> -Please take some time to go to https://ed.sc.gov/instruction/standards-learning/. The website lists the standards for each subject in third grade. Standards tell what your child needs to learn this year to be ready to move on to fourth grade. You may click on Standards or Support Documents and Resources for each subject.

<u>Student Absences</u>- Due to time constraints, we will not be able to provide work for pick up in the office. If your child is absent, they will be given their missed work when they return.

<u>Study Guides</u> -Students will usually receive study guides for Science and Social Studies. Chapter Math Test study guides are in the form of a pretest or chapter review. The study guides will be placed in their homework folder, within a labeled page protector, and brought back and forth to school each day. Students will complete the study guide in class with us as the information is taught. *Please do not feel the need to complete the study guide when seeing blanks*. If the study guide is complete and a parent has signed it, the student will receive five extra points on their test.

<u>Tardy Bell</u> -The tardy bell rings at 7:30. If students are not in their homeroom class by 7:30, they will be sent to the office for a tardy slip. Students are allowed to enter the room at 7:00, so most students have unpacked and are ready for the day and working by 7:30. When children are late to school, they miss out on valuable instruction and get behind in their work.

<u>Transportation</u> - a priority. For dismissal, we go by what you have provided for us as far as transportation home. If for some reason, there is a need for a change,

<u>Writing</u> -The students will be writing frequently in their journals as well as on the computer. They will have writing assignments in which we give prompts and sometimes they get to choose what they write about. These will be graded on occasion, so students need to keep up with their assignments. They will also complete rough drafts in this notebook. Final drafts will be done on notebook paper and turned in. Selected writings will be graded as part of their language arts grade.

<u>Ask for Help!</u> -Please encourage your child to ask questions in class if they do not fully understand something. We try to detect when students during instruction, but occasionally we can miss this. If your child does not feel comfortable asking

for help in the front of class, they may speak to us during recess or free time that we may have during class. They need to know that often the questions they have are ones that would benefit other students too.
