

Allow future teachers to get an early start earning college credits toward an education degree

Create a system for recruiting future teachers during high school

Invest in our future teachers by covering the cost of tuition and books for students in this program.

Ultimately, we hope students return to be our colleagues in Aiken County Public Schools.

- 1. 3.5 weighted GPA or Top 25%; Test score requirements are waived OR a 3.0-3.49 weighted GPA with a 1020 PSAT score
- 2. College Prep Coursework in High School
- 3. Two letters of recommendation. One must be from a teacher and one from counselor. The letter should describe the student's character, maturity, and any information about their desire to be a teacher.
- 4. Students must have reliable transportation to the USC Aiken campus.
- 5. Students must be willing to adhere to the USC Aiken Calendar which is different than the ACPSD calendar.


The General Education course options can be flexible based on the student's high school course completion and seat availability at the college.

Students would gain exposure to the field of education by taking two courses that are required for an education major.

The student interest form, letters of recommendation, and transcript/test scores will be reviewed in late March.

Students will receive notification in their ACPSD email accounts by early April.

Students complete the official dual enrollment application receiving approval from ACPSD to participate. Students will pay the \$10 application fee and submit required documents to USC Aiken.

In May, students will meet with a USC Aiken Admissions representative to select classes and make a schedule.
