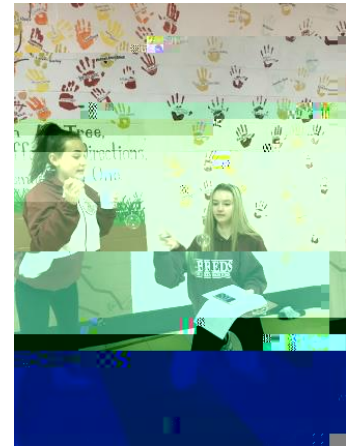

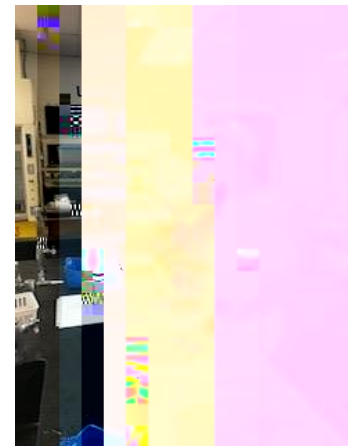
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Students who take AP courses send a signal to colleges that they're serious about their education and that they're willing to challenge themselves with rigorous coursework. 85% of selective colleges and universities report that a student's AP experience favorably impacts admission decisions.



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Research shows that students who receive a score of 3 or higher on AP Exams typically experience greater academic success in college and have higher graduation rates than their non-AP peers.



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Research shows that students who take AP courses and exams are much more likely than their peers to complete a college degree on time. Most colleges and universities nationwide offer college credit, advanced placement, or both for qualifying exam scores leading to:

- Fulfilling graduation requirements early
- Being able to skip introductory or required general-education courses
