Prerequisites: None. EMS1 will also cover HS1 material with 1 Credit for each. Must register for both EMS 1 and EMS 2. GPA 2.0 or higher in English, Math, and Science.

General Requirements: This course is recommended for students in grades 10-12.

Health Science 1, Foundations of Healthcare Professions, is an introductory course designed to provide students with an overview of healthcare careers and foundational skills to begin their journey towards the future as a healthcare professional.

EMS 1 is designed to teach students how to recognize and respond to various emergencies. Students will review basic anatomy and physiology as it relates to injury management and treatment. Students will review basic information needed for all phases of a healthcare professional. Information that students are exposed to will include legal and ethical implications, communications, safety, infection control and professionalism. In this course, students will learn what skills are necessary to recognize and care for emergencies in adults, children, and infants until professional medical help arrives. Students will obtain FA/CPR/AED certification. Students must be able to perform light physical activity.

Emergency Medical Services 2 (EMS 2)5532 - 2 CreditMedical Terminology (Dual Enrolment ATC)5540 - 1 Credit

Prerequisite: None. Must register for both EMS 1 and EMS 2.

General Requirements: This course is recommended for students in grades 10-12. Students must have been successful in EMS 1 to proceed to EMS 2. A recommendation of 75% or higher for the minimum grade.

Course Name and Description: Fire Fighter 1 (651400CD - 2 credits)

PREREQUISITE: GPA 2.0 or higher in English, math, and science (Age 16 at start of class)

Students will demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the basic concepts of safety in the Emergency and Fire Services. Students will develop a basic understanding of First Aid, CPR, Hazmat Awareness, Hazmat Operations, and Fundamentals of Fire Fighting through the Fire Fighter 1 level. Opportunity to challenge the IFSAC Fire Fighter 1 certification with the South Carolina Fire Academy if all prerequisites are complete.
